3. CRIME UPDATE

As we enter a new year it seems appropriate to reflect on our performance so far between April 2014 and January 2015.

Our main priority, after ensuring that we respond appropriately to all crimes and incidents reported daily, is also to make sure officers prioritise the issues that you people tell us concern them the most. These are included in our local ward plans and cover housebreaking, drug dealing, violent crime and antisocial behaviour.

Overall reported crime has been reduced by 11% (212 less crimes) Reductions in housebreaking vehicle crimes, assaults, are key contributors to this positive reduction.

Faced with an increase in housebreaking last year, we created a specialist team who ensure that detailed investigation is carried out for what is an invasive and frightening crime to experience. This has resulted in a significant reduction in housebreaking so far this year and three key offenders have also been imprisoned.

Domestic Housebreaking down 32% (61 less houses) with a detection rate of 50%.

1100 residents were visited by the local community policing team in East Edinburgh and offered Smartwater to forensically mark their property and also provided with additional crime prevention advice.

We have provided additional patrols at key times, working with and visiting licensed premises to tackle anti-social behaviour. Assaults have seen a 11% reduction. (49 less victims)

Local drug dealers are also high on our list of priorities. Following some excellent information and calls from the public, we have recovered several thousands pounds worth of drugs from and ensured that the dealers are placed behind bars where they are no longer able to harm our communities.

Police Scotland this week launched Operation Quarterlight, a national campaign to tackle car crime and vehicle theft across the country. Since November 2014, each week, across Scotland, more than 70 vehicles have been stolen. In addition, each week, more than 230 vehicles have either been broken into or had items stolen from them having been left insecure. Officers will focus on identifying and targeting those responsible for vehicle break-ins and thefts as well as the prevention of vehicle crime by engaging with partners, key stakeholders and members of the public. By changing habits, and working in partnership, vehicle crime can be prevented.

It's everyone's job to make East Edinburgh the safest place it can be and our thanks also go out to the local community who work with us to ensure that this particular area of Edinburgh is a very safe place to live and work.
