Energy efficient refurbishment of community owned buildings

St. Ninians Old Parish Church Hall, Stirling received a CCF grant to install and promote energy efficiency measures such as insulation, windows and lighting which have reduced carbon footprint and bills, while improving facilities.



Maryhill Climate Challenge project offer Energy Efficiency advice

Maryhill Climate Challenge project received a CCF grant to deliver energy efficiency advice in the Maryhill area of Glasgow bringing the community together to tackle climate change and reducing fuel poverty.



A 'Better Way to Work' promotes lower carbon transport options

A 'Better Way to Work' run by the Glasgow Bike Station has received CCF funding to provide free bike checks, travel planning advice, cycle training and trial bus, rail and subway passes in Glasgow. As well as reducing carbon footprint as people use lower carbon forms of transport the project is helping people experience the health benefits of cycling and walking.



Northbay Gardens and community growing space

Community groups such as Northbay Gardens, Barra have received CCF funding to provide community growing spaces, and to promote the production and consumption of food which has a lower carbon footprint. These projects have also helped promote healthy diets and bring people together, allowing them to experience the mental and physical benefits of gardening.



All applicants receive help and support from independent environmental charity Keep Scotland Beautiful who manage and develop the CCF on behalf of the Scottish Government.
