To support the consultation Keep Scotland Beautiful is running on the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Paris we have produced interpretative resources on climate change.

Climate change is a name given to the change in our climatic patterns, particularly over the last few decades. It is caused by human activities that have pumped greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. Paris 2015 is a crucial conference; it needs to reach a new international agreement on climate change, applicable to all countries, with the aim of keeping global warming below 2°C.

Keep Scotland Beautiful's Response to Climate Change

Keep Scotland Beautiful is committed to demonstrating leadership and action on climate change. This includes in areas where the charity has direct control and where it has influence and an enabling role.

Keep Scotland Beautiful recognises that climate change is a symptom of unsustainable development, caused by the emission, and increasing concentration, of greenhouse gasses in the Earth's atmosphere. We recognise that people - through consumption of resources that lead to the emission of greenhouse gasses - are the main drivers of climate change. We also recognise that people - through actions to reduce emissions and adapt to impact - are the main agents in taking positive action to address climate change. We also acknowledge that we ourselves play an important role in raising awareness and understanding, taking and empowering action, and reporting progress on tackling climate change.

We work collaboratively with others to influence and enable action on climate change. Our response to climate change includes working to influence policy at Government level while also developing carbon literacy and facilitating action on climate change at all levels throughout our Programmes.

We are also committed to measuring, managing and reporting our own climate change commitments on mitigation, adaptation and sustainability.
