Our aim with the shop is to tap into the growing interest in locally produced, high quality beer and spirits, supplied direct from the producers. We will sell responsibly and with a high level of knowledge, experience and passion for the product. We plan to improve the character and appearance of the rather neglected building and hope that our shop would compliment existing businesses.
