This statement of account for the year 2019/20 was prepared for the PCC delayed virtual Annual General Meeting held on 12th October 2020. Please note that this report will not make reference to any money held by PCC in the Traders' Account as the funds were collected by local businesspeople for Christmas lights and special events. Business Account

The activities of the community council resulted in a negative surplus for the year of £249.77 however, this gives me no concern as will be explained in the Expenditure section of this report.

I will now draw your attention to the main items of income and expenditure for the year.

Income

The only source of income is the grant of £756.74 received from The City of Edinburgh Council which is based on a standard lump sum payment plus an additional per capita contribution related to the population for the area.

Expenditure

The main items of expenditure were £254.83 for insurance, £300.00 for room hire and £356.68 for Information Communication Technology costs. Within the ICT costs, £300.00 was spent on an upgrade of the website which was covered by a grant from CEC received in 2018/19. As clarification, a double charge of £80 is shown for registration with the Information Commissioner's Office for the calendar years of 2019 and 2020. Administrative delays were experienced with communication from the ICO as email contacts were given as the personal address of the previous Secretary. Contact email addresses have been amended to the Treasurer's email address at PCC so delays should not be experienced going forward.
